


OVERALL SITE PLAN

▶ Status Update:

- ▶ Former stage removed
- ▶ Site prep & ground work occurring this month
- ▶ Construction & installation to begin this Aug. 2020
- ▶ Projects scheduled to be completed by Dec. 2020
- ▶ Council & Administration still to decide what to do with existing kiosk building

 - ▶ Improved capacity for larger events
 - ▶ Predictability of venue despite weather
 - ▶ Extended shoulder seasons
 - ▶ Community space for dances, concerts, performances, cultural demonstrations, weddings, meetings, events, festivals & more

- ▶ Funding: TOI Capital Budget & Canada Heritage
- ▶ Status Update:
 - ▶ Final Design Approved
 - ▶ 4 major components finalized (see next slides)
 - ▶ Installation to begin Aug. 2020
 - ▶ Awaiting for delivery of several components



▶ Cover Membrane


- ▶ Final artwork including language translation approved

 - ▶ Improved capacity for more vendors
 - ▶ Predictability of venue despite weather
 - ▶ Extended shoulder seasons
 - ▶ Community space for future markets, workshops, artist in residency programs, community programming, special event rentals, & more


VISITOR CENTRE / TOURISM OFFICE

▶ Why a new building?

- ▶ To provide visitor servicing year-round including showcasing small businesses, tourism operators, local retail and arts & crafts
- ▶ We want to complement (and not compete with) the services and amenities already provided by the GNWT Western Arctic Visitor Centre from mid May to mid September
- ▶ Current Town Office space does not allow for proper visitor servicing; new space will allow tourism staff to interact with visitors while Town Office staff can maintain residents as their priority
- ▶ To have a signature & designated visitor reception space for the Town of Inuvik with retail, promotion, & small interpretive space that is modern, welcoming, and interactive
- ▶ To provide a central meeting space / workshop space for community groups and artists
- ▶ By having full-time, year round staff on site we are able to better manage the space and provide services and programming in one central location


ARCTIC MARKET & VISITOR/TOURISM BUILDING


- ▶ Funding: TOI Capital Budget & CanNor
- ▶ Status Update:
 - ▶ Received final design concept & preliminary drawings to Tender from Architects
 - ▶ Invitation to Tender for Building Construction posted on July 22
 - ▶ Updated construction drawings provided by Architects on Tuesday, August 4
 - ▶ Addendum sent to 16 registered bidders, including some local firms
 - ▶ At request of bidders, Tender extended until Aug 19
 - ▶ Site preparation required (utilidor, pilings, electrical)
 - ▶ Confirmation pending of additional funds from funding partner
 - ▶ Construction to begin shortly after Tender award
 - ▶ Scheduled for completion by December 2020














10 Arctic Market Diagram
